The law requires that new residential pools, spas and hot tubs shall be equipped with at least one pool safety feature as specified in 515 F.S. A summary of which is, in addition to the present fence/screen enclosure requirements, all new pool, spa and hot tubs shall have at least one of the following safety features:

- 1. "An approved safety pool cover" means a manually or power-operated safety pool cover that meets all the performance standards of the American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) in compliance with Standard F1346-91.
- 2. "Barrier means a fence, dwelling wall, or non-dwelling wall, or any combination thereof, which completely surrounds the swimming pool obstructs access to the swimming pool, especially access from the yard outside the barrier.
 - a) The barrier must be at least four (4) feet high on the outside.
 - b) The barrier may not have any gaps, opening indentations, protrusions, or structural components that could allow a young child to crawl under, squeeze through or climb over the barrier.
 - c) Access gates, when provided, shall be self-closing and shall comply with the requirements of Sections R4501.17.1.1 through R4501.17.1.7 and shall be equipped with a self-latching locking device located on the pool side of the gate. Where the device release is located no less than 54 inches (1372 mm) from the bottom of the gate, the device release mechanism may be located on either side of the gate and so placed that it cannot be reached by a young child over the top or through any opening or gap from the outside. Gates that provide access to the swimming pool must open outward away from the pool. The gates and barrier shall have no opening greater than ½ inch (12.7 mm) within 18 inches (457 mm) of the release mechanism.
- 3. "Exit Alarm" means a device that makes audible, continuous alarm sounds when any door or window which permits access from the residence to any pool area that is with an intervening enclosure, is opened or left ajar.

Any person who fails to equip a new residential pool, spa or hot tub with at least one safety feature as required by the new Florida Statute will be considered as committing a misdemeanor or the second degree.
